

Changes coming to park in Radnor

The Radnor Township Board of Trustees is pleased to announce the groundbreaking for significant improvements to the Radnor Community Park, located at 4230 State Route 203 in Radnor. The event took place on the morning of Monday, Nov. 24, at the park entrance.

Key upgrades include a relocated park entrance, enhanced parking and circulation, and the addition of a 2,100-foot recreational trail. MLS Construction Services, LLC has been contracted to complete the work, with completion scheduled for April 2026.

Funding and legislative support

The improvements are primarily financed through an Ohio Department of Natural Resources grant, provided via the state bi-annual budget. The Radnor Township Board of Trustees extends sincere thanks to state Sen. Andrew Brenner (R-Delaware) and state Rep. Beth Lear (R-Galena) for their support in securing these vital funds.

"We are truly grateful to our legislators for their steadfast support and for helping secure the necessary funds to make these park improvements possible," Township Trustee Dan Boysel said.

Township Trustee Cameron James added: "A special thank you goes out to Trustee-Elect Donna Meyer for working with National Lime and Stone to secure donated gravel for the upgraded parking and trails. Additionally, thank you to Hensel Ready Mix for contributing materials for a concrete approach for the new park entrance off State Route 203."

This project is fully funded by grants, donations, and volunteer labor and equipment, ensuring that there is no direct cost to local taxpayers.

Historic entrance

The new entrance to Radnor Community Park is centralized around the historic flagpole, a landmark that remains following the demolition of the old Radnor School. This area will also feature a commemorative plaque honoring the history of the site and the former school.

Future park improvements

Joe Clase, planner with Plan 4 Land, LLC, said: "We have been collaborating with the Radnor Parks Committee to identify additional improvements desired for the park. The park plan, which is available for viewing at Radnor Township Hall, includes proposals for enhanced playgrounds, ballfields, and other amenities as future funding becomes available."

The Radnor Township Board of Trustees has established a fund with the Delaware County Foundation dedicated to park development.
